

Driver Requirements

All MVR's must be submitted to and approved by underwriting before driver is considered acceptable. Drivers must fully comply with the following criteria or the drivers will not be acceptable to Underwriters.

- 1) Driver must be between the age of 21 and 70 years of age.
- 2) Driver must have a verifiable minimum of two (2) years commercial truck driving experience.
- 3) No more than four (4) minor violations in the last three (3) years, with no more than two (2) in the last year.
- 4) No more than one (1) chargeable accident in the last three (3) years.
- 5) No Major violations in the last three (3) years.
- 6) Single, valid, full commercial driving license endorsed for the equipment being operated.
- 7) No license suspensions (any suspensions for failure to appear must be submitted to Underwriters for approval).

Minor Violation Definitions:

- All moving violations other than major violations listed below are considered minor violations.
- The following non-moving violations are considered to be minor violations:
 - Defective breaks
 - Defective equipment
 - Oversize
 - Overweight - two (2) overweight violations equals one (1) minor violation

Major Violation Definitions:

- DWI, DUI, implied consent, any drug related violation.
- Manslaughter or negligent homicide
- Felony involving a motor vehicle
- Racing
- Hit and run or leaving the scene of an accident
- Reckless driving
- License suspension for points
- Driving with a suspended license
- Fleeing/eluding police/arrest
- Multiple driver licenses not reported to company
